Criteria for appointment: Applicants must meet the specific representation of the position in which the vacancy exists.

The purposes of this commission are to work with the First 5 California Children and Families Commission in the implementation of the "California Children and Families First Act of 1998", which was enacted by the California electorate as Proposition 10, and to develop and adopt an adequate and complete county strategic plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within Kings County.
