Dear Mr. Aljabiry:

Enclosed for your review and approval is the Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP adds the new Federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) projects programmed against the ARRA fund source programmed in Amendment 3 to the 2009 FTIP. This amendment meets all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450 and 40 CFR Part 93.

Due to very short ARRA funding obligation deadlines, it is requested that both the State and Federal Agencies approval process be expedited to the extent possible to allow KCAG to move forward with the obligation of the projects with the ARRA funds.

The public participation process for Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP is consistent with KCAG's adopted Public Participation Plan (PPP). On March 10, 2009 KCAG began a 14-day public review and comment period which concluded on March 24, 2009. On March 25, 2009 the KCAG Transportation Policy Committee approved Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP by resolution. State and Federal approval is required for Amendment No. 4.

Included with this letter are two hard copies of Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP. An electronic copy of the four year financial plan will be sent via email. Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP is available online on KCAG's website at www.countyofkings.com/kcag.

WHEREAS, federal planning regulations require Metropolitan Planning Organizations to prepare and adopt a long range Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for their region; and

WHEREAS, federal planning regulations require that Metropolitan Planning Organizations prepare and adopt a Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) for their region; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) has been prepared to comply with Federal and State requirements for local projects and through a cooperative process between the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), the State Department of Transportation (Caltrans), principal elected officials of general purpose local governments and their staffs, and public owner operators of mass transportation services acting through the KCAG forum and general public involvement; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the FTIP program listing is consistent with: 1) the 2007 Regional Transportation Plan; 2) the 2008 State Transportation Improvement Program; and 3) the Corresponding Conformity Analysis; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP contains the MPO's certification of the transportation planning process assuring that all federal requirements have been fulfilled; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP meets all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP adds the Federal Economic Stimulus Lump Sum program and a specific list of Economic Stimulus projects; and

WHEREAS, projects submitted in Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP must be financially constrained and the financial plan affirms that funding is available; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP is consistent with the federally approved Conformity Analysis for Amendment No. 2 to the 2009 Federal Transportation Improvement Program and 2007 Regional Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP does not interfere with the timely implementation of the Transportation Control Measures; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP conforms to the applicable SIPs;
and

WHEREAS, a 14-day public review process occurred from March 10, 2009 to March 24, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the KCAG Transportation Policy Committee adopts Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the KCAG Transportation Policy Committee finds that the 2007 Regional Transportation Plan and Amendment No. 4 to the 2009 FTIP is in conformity with the requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act Amendments and applicable State Implementation Plan for air quality.

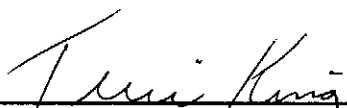
